 - Ezekiel 36:22,32
 - Matt 28:19
 - Acts 1:8
 - Acts 2
 - Ephesians 1:5-6
 - Romans 11:33-36
 - Revelation 5:9-14



- Missions Must Be Christological
 - John 14:6
 - Acts 4:12
 - Revelation 5: how did they get there?
 - Romans 10:13-17

- Missions Must Be Ecclesiological
 - Mt 16:18
 - Acts
 - Epistles of the NT
 - Pastoral Epistles
 - 1 Timothy 3:14-15

 - Revelation 5
