## book of the month The Godly Man's Picture – Thomas Watson

The Godly Man's Picture is one of my favorite books because of what it has contributed to my own thinking and holiness over the years. The book opens with these words: "The soul being so precious, and salvation so glorious, it is the highest point of prudence to make preparations for another world." Watson aids the reader in making these preparations by succinctly describing many necessary manifestations of holiness in the Christian. I have returned to this book many times in order to reread certain sections or reference a quote on a particular subject because the book covers so much so succinctly. If you cannot read it in one month, it will be worth however long it takes to read it cover to cover.

## **READING TIPS:**

- 1. Remember that Watson is a well-educated Puritan writing from England in the 17<sup>th</sup> century, so some of his diction might be a bit unfamiliar. A mobile dictionary app might come in handy at times.
- 2. Watson was a master of the English language. Pay attention to his use of analogies and illustrations. These help drive home the theological truth being communicated as well as make it more memorable
- 3. As with many Puritan writers, Watson writes in a detailed outline format. This means that each chapter is broken up into main points, sub-points, and sub-sub-points. So don't hesitate to read in short spurts at times. 2-5 minutes (on breaks at work, in the

bathroom, before bed, etc.) is often enough time to complete an entire thought. Suggested One-Month Reading Plan (about 63 pages per week)


