Summary

Why is this happening to me? Is God in control? Does He know what He's doing?

At some point, perhaps recently, you have asked one of those unanswerable why questions that closely follow a difficult circumstance, ongoing trial or unexpected crisis. In contrast to what we feel, we know the Bible teaches that God is always good (Ps. 34:8, 107:1, Js. 1:17) and He works everything together for the good for those who are His (Rom. 8:28) to the degree that the most difficult of circumstances cannot get in the way of His intentions (Gen. 50:20). In God's providence, your circumstances are designed according to God's good intentions.

God's Providence can be defined by His sovereignty *over* all things and His purposes *in* all things. That is, nothing that happens in your life is happening outside God's control and nothing He brings into your life is without purpose. *The Mystery of Providence* is a fitting title because seeing God's purposes in every circumstance are not always intuitive. Flavel brings the biblical perspective we need to see our circumstances rightly by joining the sovereignty of God and the purposes of God in a way that produces endurance in the life of the believer.

The Reading Recommendations

February is a short month; *The Mystery of Providence* is a long book. Don't let that discourage you from picking up this excellent resource. 9-10 pages per day will get you through the book in February, however you might benefit from a slower pace. Whatever your pace, you will appreciate how Flavel brings a biblical perspective to disorienting circumstances right away.

As you interact with each chapter, keep a list of provisions from God that have worked together for your good and His purposes. Each chapter will add to your perspective on God's goodness and keeping a list of His provision in your life will strengthen your endurance to walk faithfully in whatever God has around the corner for you.
