
Every single one of us at Grace Bible Church—indeed every Christian saved by grace, adopted into God's family—ought to be characterized by hospitality.

Hospitality is commanded, exemplified, and commended throughout the Bible, especially in the New Testament. This is because we are to love each other in the church with a brotherly love made possible (and required) by God's love for us, his enemies-made-children: "We love because He first loved us (1 John 4:19)." The early church was undeniably characterized by this God-imitating gospel use of their homes. Elders must possess it. All Christians should practice it.

Hospitality Commands is a very short, but incredibly theologically rich, and

yet practical, short book. **It can easily be read in one month. I encourage you to do so.** Make practical efforts in your own life to follow Strauch's instructions, encouragements, and example to increase the presence of hospitality in your own home.
