

Unshakeable Joy - Cameron Dodd

It is a special opportunity when we get to have a book of the month written by one of the precious members of GBC (Cameron Dodd). Even more special is that this is a biography of her husband, Matt Dodd, a long-time part of GBC, a missionary we sent to Papua New Guinea, a man of emulatable faith and joy in God, and my best friend for more than a decade.

Unshakeable Joy would be a helpful, encouraging read for anybody. In it, Cameron walks the reader quickly through Matt's life and the experiences that God used to shape him into a Bibletranslating missionary who



was prepared to face a terminal cancer diagnosis and the process of dying with steadfast faith, infectious joy, and God-honoring perseverance. Then the book slows down and takes the readers slowly through those final months of Matt's life until—despite intense pain and real suffering—with more joy than he had while he lived, Matt left this body to be with the Lord he loved. This book will grant its readers an eternal perspective that will enable God-glorifying faith and joy in life... or in death. I commend it to all.

But for those of us at Grace Bible, it is an even more precious book. Because it is about one of our own whose legacy lives on among us. Matt's wife—the author, Cameron—continues in our body. We see and interact with his sweet children—Susanna, Benaiah, Onesimus, and Mary —each Sunday. The team that he co-founded with the Canns in PNG continues to serve in the Finisterre Mountains in the village of Maweroro where the gospel has been proclaimed and a new fledgling church has started. And countless Christians who Matt discipled, encouraged, and otherwise impacted are members of our church and those we have planted. GBC, when you read this book, we learn about ourselves and the God who continues to be at work in us.
