### **LOOKING BACK...**

Look back at your notes from April 8 (D3 - Admonish, Encourage and Help). Remind yourself of the four principles each Christian should be aware of in his interactions with others in the body.

### **ADMONISH THE UNRULY**

\* A faithful brother is one who is ready to speak a word of warning into the mind of the unruly man. What are some gospel truths we should use to prepare our hearts before we admonish the unruly one?

### **ENCOURAGE THE FAINTHEARTED**

\* The faithful man is ready to speak a soothing word from close proximity to a friend whose with a small soul. What are some encouraging gospel truths you can share with your fainthearted brother?

### **HELP THE WEAK**

The weak brother lacks the biblical foundation necessary to make wise decisions. Can you think of a situation where a brother has a true material need that is due to an unsound biblical foundation? How would you help this man?

**LOOKING DAY BY DAY...**

Consider using part of your daily prayer time to grow your affections for Christ.

1. Read Galatians 4:4,5. Agree with Jesus that He was uniquely qualified to accomplish salvation at the cross. It is because He was the Son of God that He was qualified to be the sinless sacrifice. And it is because He was born of a woman that He was able to take the sinner's place in God's system of justice.
  
2. Read 2 Corinthians 5:21. Thank Jesus for His willingness to take the sin of every believer upon Himself so that His righteousness could be transferred onto them.
  
3. Read Hebrews 5:8,9. Thank Jesus for His obedience to endure the full suffering of the cross. Agree with Him that He alone is the source of eternal salvation.
  
4. Read Revelation 20:11-15. Agree with Jesus that one day He will sit on a white throne and condemn to a lake of fire every man, woman and child who rejected Him as King and Savior.

**LOOKING AHEAD...**

In preparation for Saturday, April 22, "Train Yourself for Godliness", answer honestly. Describe your personal desire to be godly.

How is this desire or lack thereof visible in your daily life? Speak to specific practices (like Bible reading) but also at work, at home, and at play?
