The Special Purpose and Place of Job in the Bible (part 2):

Through Job God provides early gospel anticipations which help us remain faithful to Him in our suffering.

- 1. A satanic attack against God tests the faithfulness of His innocent servant (review).
- 2. An innocent servant faithfully endures undeserved suffering (review).
- 3. The cries of an innocent sufferer are not always answered by God (review).

- 4. God ordains mystery and misunderstanding within undeserved suffering (review).
- 5. God restores sinners through an innocent sufferer.

6. Great blessing awaits an innocent servant after undeserved suffering.

7. The undeserved suffering of an innocent servant is a theologically rich but costly scene.
