The Special Purpose and Place of Job in the Bible (Classes 2-3):

Through Job God provides early gospel anticipations which help us remain faithful to Him in our suffering.

- 1. A satanic attack against God tests the faithfulness of His innocent servant.
- 2. An innocent servant faithfully endures undeserved suffering.
- 3. The cries of an innocent sufferer are not always answered by God.
- 4. God ordains mystery and misunderstanding within undeserved suffering.
- 5. God restores sinners through an innocent sufferer.
- 6. Great blessing awaits an innocent servant after undeserved suffering.
- 7. The undeserved suffering of an innocent servant is a theologically rich but costly scene.

Four Concerns in the scene of suffering - part 1 (Class 4):

1. Are you concerned about CHARACTER?

2. Are you concerned to COMFORT the sufferer?

3. Are you concerned to CONTROL yourself?
