CLASS 2 - WORSHIP: A TRINITARIAN PRIORITY

Review

1A. What is worship?

"The word worship comes from the Saxon word weorthscype, which later became worthship. To worship God is to ascribe the proper worth to God, to magnify His worthiness of praise, or better, to approach and address God as He is worthy. As the Holy and Almighty God, the Creator and Sustainer of the Universe, the Sovereign Judge to whom we must give an account, He is worthy of all the worth and honor we can give Him and then infinitely more." - Donald S. Whitney (Spiritual Disciplines for the Christian Life, 87)

"Worship is the theme of salvation history, the supreme purpose for which believers were redeemed (John 4:23), and the occupation with which they will be eternally enthralled (Rev. 22:3-4; cf. 19:1-6). To worship the Lord is to ascribe to him the honor, glory, adoration, praise, reverence, and devotion that is due him, both for his greatness and for his goodness." - John MacArthur/Richard Mayhue (*Biblical Doctrine*, 790-791)
