LOOKING AT OUR BIBLE READING...

From your reading, how has God used something in your reading to shape your thinking or help to train you as a biblical woman?

LOOKING AHEAD...

In preparation for lesson 10, "D3-MINISTRY: Paul's Example (1 Thessalonians 1-2)," read 1 Thessalonians 1-2 at least twice. As you read, answer the following questions:

1. List some observations you make about the relationship between the messengers (Paul, Silas and Timothy) and the recipients (the Thessalonians).

For example, 1:2—they were full of prayer and thankfulness for the Thessalonians

2. Write some observations about the Thessalonians from these chapters. Look for answers to questions such as these: Who had they been serving? What happened when they heard and believed the gospel? What were they enduring?
