LOOKING BACK...

1. Review your notes from "A Whole Bible Survey of the Home." Please share something that stood out to you (maybe something that was new, encouraging, or challenging).

What did you learn about God's heart for the household and what are the implications for you personally?

2. How would you describe the spiritual influence you have in your home? Think about your attitudes (1 Peter 3:1-4), your words (Prov. 16:24; Eph. 4:29; Col. 4:6), and your actions (1 Jn. 3:18; Mark 10:45; Acts 20:35). What is going well? What are ways you would like to change, and what steps will you take, by God's grace, to do so?

LOOKING DAY BY DAY...

3. Look through your Wellspring Songbook. Choose several songs to use this week to help you prepare your heart for your time reading God's Word. If you are keeping a theme journal, select songs that complement your theme.

How has this activity helped you to shepherd your heart toward God and Jesus Christ with the Word of God and the gospel? If you haven't tried it yet, how might it help?

LOOKING AHEAD...

4. In preparation for D1 teaching on 1-22-2015, read Galatians 5, especially verses 16-23.
