Introduction:

Six Questions to Investigate How God Wants Us to Practice Biblical Relationships within the Local Church:

1. How does God want us to practice loving one another?

- a. Love one another (John 13:34-35)

- b. Love one another (1 John 3:11, 1 John 3:23)

- c. Love one another (1 John 4:11)

2. How does God want us to practice caring for one another?

a. Care for one another (1 Corinthians 12:25)

b. Bear one another's burdens (Galatians 6:2)

3. How does God want us to practice edifying one another?

a. Build up one another (1 Thessalonians 5:11, Romans 14:19)

b. Admonish one another (Romans 15:14, Colossians 3:16)

4. How does God want us to practice being humble with one another?

a. Give preference to one another (Romans 12:10)

b. Confess your sins to one another (James 5:16)

5. How does God want us to practice serving one another?

a. Serve one another (1 Peter 4:10, Galatians 5:13)

b. Wash one another's feet (John 13:14)

6. How does God want us to practice being unified with one another?

a. Be devoted to one another (Romans 12:10)

b. Let us not judge one another (Romans 14:13)
