- Proverbs 5:3-6- For the lips of an adulteress drip honey and smoother than oil is her speech; but in the end she is bitter as wormwood, sharp as a two-edged sword. Her feet go down to death, her steps take hold of Sheol She does not ponder the path of life; her ways are unstable, she does not know it.
- Proverbs 22:14- The mouth of an adulteress is a deep pit; he who is cursed of the Lord will fall into it.
- Proverbs 30:20- This is the way of an adulterous woman: she eats and wipes her mouth, and says, "I have done no wrong."

B. The foolish woman is _____.

- Proverbs 10:4- Poor is he who works with a **negligent** hand, but the hand of the diligent makes rich.
- Proverbs 6:9-11- How long will you lie down, O **sluggard**? When will you rise from your sleep? A little sleep, a little slumber, and little folding of the hands to rest- your poverty will come in like a vagabond and your need like an armed man.
- Proverbs 19:24- The **sluggard** buries his hand in the dish, but will not even bring it back to his mouth.
- Proverbs 21:25- The desire of the **sluggard** puts him to death, for his hands refuse to work.

- Proverbs 19:13- the **contentions** of a wife are a constant dripping.
- Proverbs 21:9 & 19- It is better to live in the corner of a roof than in a house shared with a **contentious** woman. It is better to live in a desert land than with a contentious and vexing woman.
- Proverbs 25:24- It is better to live in the corner of a roof than in a house shared with a **contentious** woman.
- Proverbs 27:15-16- A constant dripping on a day or steady rain and a **contentious** woman are alike. He who would restrain her restrains the wind and he grasps oil with his right hand.
