The sufferings summarized (this is what He had to suffer):
- Simeon said His birth was "a sign to be opposed;" "Herod searched to destroy Him;" "the dragon might devour the child;" at Nazareth they were filled with rage, drove Him out of the city to throw Him down a cliff; they said He is a blasphemer; they said He casts out demons by Beelzebul; they said He is a Samaritan and has a demon; they said He is insane; they said He is a gluttonous man and a drunkard; they said His testimony is not true; He said the Son of Man has no where to lay His head; they falsely accused Him; they tested Him maliciously; they conspired to destroy Him; they tried to trap Him; they dishonored Him; they said He has lost His senses; they were not believing Him; they sought to seize Him; they watched and spied on Him to catch Him; they wanted to seize Him by stealth and kill Him; they were very hostile toward Him; they plotted against Him; they were persecuting Jesus; they hated Him without a cause; they picked up stones to stone Him; Judas planned to betray Him to the religious leadership; His soul was deeply grieved to the point of death; His soul was troubled; He was troubled in spirit.

V. Jesus' suffering at His trial and cross.

- They accused Him of blaspheming; they spat in His face; He received slaps in the face; they beat Him with their fists; they accused Him harshly; they bound Him; they delivered Him to Pilate; they handed Him over for envy; they yelled "Crucify Him"; they scourged Him; they crowned Him with thorns; they mocked Him with a purple robe, bowing down before Him; they beat Him on the head with a reed; they crucified Him; they hurled abuse at Him on the cross; they sneered at Him; He refused wine mixed with gall and/or myrrh (would not allow the pain to be blunted); they insulted Him; He knew He was "forsaken" by God; He cried out with a loud voice; He cried "It is finished;" they pierced His side.

These benefits summarized:
- We have been drawn to God because He was lifted up at the cross; the salvation work we needed is finished (nothing left for us or anyone else to contribute); our griefs and sorrows are borne/taken away; we don't have to be pierced through for our own transgressions; we don't have to be crushed for our iniquities; we don't have to be chastened; we are healed; our iniquity is taken away; we don't have to receive the stroke that is due us; our guilt is taken away; God's wrath is satisfied; we are justified (by His blood); declared righteous; we have forgiveness of sins; our sin is taken away/wiped away; our sins are not counted against us; we are spiritually rich through His poverty at the cross; we are rescued from this present evil age; God publicly demonstrated His righteousness; we are not delivered over to judgment because of our transgressions; we are saved from wrath; we are reconciled; we are united with Him in His death; our old self was crucified; our body of sin is done away with in that we are no longer slaves to sin; we no longer live for self; Christ lives in us; we have been freely given all things necessary; we are not chargeable, condemnable; we have an Intercessor; we are inseparable from Christ; we are loved; we overwhelmingly conquer no matter how dire the circumstances are; we are loved; we have comfort in abundance; we have been redeemed from the curse of the law; we do not have to bear the curse; the blessing of Abraham is ours; we are brought near to God; we are united with others in a body, a new man; all horizontal (and vertical) barriers are broken down; the enmity tied to the law is undone; peace has been established (vertically/horizontally in the church); we are loved; we are sanctified; we are cleansed with His word; we are presented spotless, blameless in all our glory (as a body to Christ); we are holy; we are rescued from the domain of darkness and transferred into His kingdom; the certificate of debt with decrees against us and all hostility against us in judgment is canceled out; we have the only power effective against fleshly indulgences; we are not destined for wrath but for obtaining salvation; we have a Mediator; we are ransomed; we are redeemed from every lawless deed; we are purified to be a part of His unique people; we are zealous for good deeds; we have purification for our sins; the devil has been rendered powerless regarding death; we are freed from the fear of death; we have a merciful and faithful and sympathetic High Priest who is able to aid in our temptations; we have the once and for all sacrifice needed; we have eternal redemption; we have a cleansed conscience; we are confident to enter the holy place; we can draw near to God with a sincere heart and full assurance of faith; our hearts are sprinkled clean, evil conscience cleansed, body washed; we are loved and released from our sins by His blood; we are purchased and brought into a kingdom of priests; we will reign; repentance for forgiveness of sins can be announced; our message of His cross (suffering) is the power of God; we have a message of reconciliation entrusted to us, AND

CONCLUSIONS:

From, "Suffering and the Sovereignty of God" (chapter 3 - 'The Purposes of God in Suffering'), Piper, Taylor (general editors)

- ".... suffering is an essential part of the created universe in which the greatness of the glory of the grace of God can be most fully revealed. Suffering is an essential part of the tapestry of the universe so that the weaving of grace can be seen for what it really is." 82
- ".... This was the moment Good Friday for which everything in the universe was planned." 82

"All who dwell on earth will worship [the beast], everyone whose name has not been written before the foundation of the world in the book of life of the Lamb that was slain.' That is a good, careful, literal translation. This means that before the world was created there was book called the book of life of the Lamb that was slain. The Lamb is Jesus Christ crucified. The book is the book of Jesus Christ crucified. Therefore, before God made the world He had in view Jesus Christ slain, and He had in view a people purchased but His blood written in the book. Therefore, the suffering of Jesus was not at afterthought, as though the work of creation did not go the way God planned. . . . The slaying of the Lamb was in view before the work of creation began." 82-83

".... The aim of creation is the fullest, clearest, surest display of the greatness of the glory of the grace of God. And that display would be the slaughter of the best Being in the universe for millions of undeserving sinners. The suffering and death of the Lamb of God in history is the best possible display of the glory of the grace of God. That is why God planned it before the foundation of the world." 83

Consider Revelation 5:9-12. "The hosts of heaven focus their worship not simply on the Lamb, but on the 'Lamb who was slain.' And they are still singing this song in Revelation 15:3. Therefore we can conclude that the centerpiece of worship in heaven for all eternity will be the display of the glory of the grace of God in the slaughtered Lamb. Angels and all the redeemed will sing of the suffering of the Lamb forever and ever. The suffering of the Son of God will never be forgotten. The greatest suffering in history will be at the center of our worship and our wonder forever and ever. This is not an afterthought of God. This is the plan from before the foundation of the world. Everything else is subordinate to this plan. Everything else is put in place for the sake of this plan: the display of the greatness of the glory of the grace of God in the suffering of the Beloved is the goal of the creation and the goal of all history. . . . Do you see what this implies about sin and suffering in the universe? According to this divine plan, God permits sin to enter the world. God ordains that what He hates will come to pass. It is not sin in God to will that there be sin." 85

"When sin entered the world, horrible, horrible things followed. Diseases, defect, disabilities, natural catastrophes, human atrocities - from the youngest infant to the oldest codger, from the vilest scoundrel to the sweetest saint - suffering is no respecter of persons." 86

"He ordains that suffering come - 'though He cause grief' (Lam 3:32-33) - but His delight is not in the suffering, but in the great purpose of creation: the display of the glory of the grace of God in the suffering of Christ for the salvation of sinners. The stage has been set. The drama of redemptive history begins to unfold. Sin is now in its full and deadly force. Suffering and death are present and ready to consume the Son of God when He comes. All things are now in place for the greatest possible display of the glory of the grace of God." 86

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Session 4 - Motivated to Run

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I. If we are going to endure, we will endure because we believe these <u>truths</u> about Jesus, not because we have risen to the occasion through personal fortitude.

- II. We are motivated to run when we...
 - a. Remember witnesses to emulate.
 - b. Look to Jesus to <u>escape temptation</u> and <u>endure trials</u>.
 - c. Anticipate <u>Heaven</u> to <u>hold fast</u>.
 - i. Jesus is the Founder and Perfecter of our faith.
 - ii. We run by holding onto both **Calvary** and **Heaven**.
 - iii. May we run like we are strangers on earth and citizens in heaven!
