INTRODUCTION:

1. Jesus' view of the Old Testament.

Matthew 5:17-18.

Key Statement 1: The OT is in a dependent relationship with Jesus Christ – without Him the OT falls short of its intended fulfillment.

John 5:39-40.

Key Statement 2: The salvation life the OT reveals and anticipated is in no way contradictory to Jesus – it IS Jesus.

Key Statement 3: The OT is a viable option for learning more about the One who is the salvation life for the Christian – Jesus Christ!

John 5:45-47.

Key Statement 4: The arrival of Jesus obligates all who read the Pentateuch to move to the One Moses wrote about – Jesus.

Luke 24:25-27, 44-47.

Key Statement 5: The gospel of Jesus has its roots or rebar in the OT (the Christ's substitutionary sacrificial death, His resurrection, proclamation of salvation in Him to the nations).

Key Statement 6: Jesus appeals to His disciples from the OT as a source of authority concerning Himself and His salvation work.

Key Statement 7: The challenge for disciples of Jesus regarding the OT lies more in the heart than in the OT texts.
